The Manteno Police Department operates an AM radio station for Community Notification and truck route information. The radio station is AM 530.

Tornado Sirens

The Village of Manteno currently has four outdoor tornado warning sirens that provide coverage for the Village. It is important to know that these sirens are outdoor warning sirens; they are not designed to warn people that are inside of structures. The tornado sirens are tested monthly on the first Tuesday of every month. If you do not hear a siren outside on the first Tuesday of the month, or if you have a question concerning the tornado sirens please call the Manteno Police Department at 815-929-4801.

Tornado Shelters

The St. Joseph Catholic Church (207 S. Main Street) and the Manteno Church of the Nazarene (698 N. Locust Street) have graciously offered their church basements to citizens seeking shelter from tornado alerts. Designated individuals will do their best to open the facilities upon activation of the village alarm system. There are no pets allowed.

Lightning Prediction System

The THOR GUARD prediction system is located at Heritage Park and Legacy Park and is in cooperation with the school district at the Manteno High School. The systems are designed to predict lightning in our local area BEFORE lightning strikes. An alarm horn will sound along with a strobe light to warn people that are in our parks, at school functions or in their backyards that conditions are favorable for lightning. Electric

The Village of Manteno participates in a Municipal Electrical Aggregation Program. Residents are allowed to choose who supplies their electricity. The Village has procured a contract with Dynegy Energy for a 31-month term ending September 2017 at a rate of 6.996 cents per kWh for the first year and then 6.772 cents for the remaining 19 months of the term. Residents may use this company or choose their own.

New residents are not automatically enrolled in this program.



KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY CLEAN

Garbage

Household garbage is picked up weekly on your regularly scheduled pick up day. Each business within the village has received, at no extra cost, a 95-gallon garbage cart with lid and on wheels. Additional carts are also available for rent from A&J Disposal.

Garbage may also be placed in garbage bags or your own 35 gallon cans (up to 3 per week) as long as each weighs no more than 50 pounds each.

For more information on household garbage or to request an additional container, please contact A&J Disposal at 708-748-8381.

Recycling

Recyclables are picked up every other week on your regularly scheduled pickup day. Each business within the village has received, at no extra cost, a 65-gallon garbage cart with lid and on wheels. Additional carts are also available for rent from A&J Disposal.

This cart should be used for recyclables only; no garbage or yard waste.

Stickers with recycling pick up schedule are available at the Village Hall, local banks and Manteno Public Library.

If you do not have a container or would like to reserve an additional container, please contact A&J Disposal at 708-748-8381.

ACCEPTED ITEMS:

- Newspapers, magazines, envelopes, white/colored copy paper, wrapping paper, computer paper, glossy paper, file folders, telephone books, paper bags, cereal boxes, cake mix boxes, paperback books & cardboard
 - Pop cans, soup cans, coffee cans, etc.
 - Clear and colored glass containers
 - Pop bottles, water bottles, cooking oil bottles, peanut butter jars (lids included), milk and juice jugs, margarine/butter tubs, yogurt cups, ketchup bottles, household cleaners, and coffee creamers

Please rinse out your items. Labels may be left on.

NOT ACCEPTED:

- Self-stick labels, gum/candy wrappers, tissue paper, waxed paper, paper cups, paper towels, shredded paper, used paper plates or pizza boxes.
- No fiber soiled with food waste.
- Styrofoam, packing peanuts, carry-out containers, CD/DVD cases, plastic silverware, film plastics (plastic bags, saran wrap, shrink wrap, bubble wrap), solo cups, prescription bottles, aerosol cans, aluminum foil, flat glass, light bulbs, flatware, ceramics or Pyrex

F-Waste

Recycling of unused, unwanted computers, monitors, peripherals, and other electronic equipment is an important step in protecting the environmental quality of the Village of Manteno. Recycling electronics avoids potential air, water, and land pollution which can result from disposal in a landfill. The Village of Manteno is pleased to offer an opportunity for residents to recycle their E-Waste.

If you are a resident within the Village limits, you may call Village Hall at 815-929-4800 for a pickup. Public Works will do pickups on Mondays during regular work hours of 8am-4pm.

Community Clean Up Day

The Village of Manteno holds a clean up every spring. Please consider participating in this annual event to help with some community spring cleaning!

Brush Pick Up

Brush pick up takes place from the first full week in April until the last week of October. The town is divided into 2 routes. Both routes collect like your garbage pick-up; please make sure that brush is in the parkway for a Monday morning collection.

- The North route includes all homes north of Division Street. Brush pick up starts the first and third Mondays of the month.
- The South route includes all homes south of Division Street. Brush pick up starts the second and fourth Mondays of the month.



Things to consider

- No yard waste (leaves, grass clippings or weeds).
- Small trees and branches are to be brought to the curb.
- Do not use any ropes, strings or wire to bundle up the brush.
- Don't worry about cutting up branches as long as they can be handled by 2 workers and not any bigger than 14" in diameter.

Snow Removal

The Public Works Department has a set course of action for any possible winter storm. From a light snow response that requires salt applications to a multi-day/night event requiring a 24+ hour plowing operation, the goal is to create a safe driving experience in a timely and safe method.

Things to consider

- When clearing a private driveway or sidewalks, do not push or throw snow onto the street.
 - o This creates unsafe driving conditions.
 - o Snow will eventually end up either back on the private drive or in your neighbor's driveway.
- Follow village parking regulations to help with snow plowing.
 - o Please park on the even address side of the street on even days.
 - o Please park on the odd address side of the street on odd days.

Street Sweeping

The street sweeper runs every Friday. The same route is cleaned each week and consists of the downtown area (Main, Oak, First, Second and Third Streets), Rt. 50 and Division Street. Additional sections of town are cleaned based on a routine schedule or on the amount of debris that is in the curb (older parts of town with large trees demand more cleanings).

Things to consider

- Do not rake or blow leaves into the street from private yards or parkways
 - o This will overwhelm the street sweeper and cause a backup in the machine.
 - o Rake leaves and dispose of them using yard waste bags.
- Follow village parking regulations to help with street sweeping.
 - o Please park on the even address side of the street on even days.
 - o Please park on the odd address side of the street on odd days.

Yard waste

The Village's yard waste program begins the 1st Monday in April and ends the last Monday in November.

Please do not mix your yard waste or grass clippings with normal trash. You MUST separate yard waste and grass clippings into the appropriate yard waste bags. The stickers are needed if you use an unlabeled brown bag. You may purchase pre-labeled bags and stickers at the following locations:

Village Ordinance prohibits grass clippings from being blown into the streets. Fines will be enforced.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

The Village code for Manteno has been designed to serve and protect our residents. The following condensed ordinances represent those most often questioned or are of general interest.

Building Permits

A building permit is generally required for all home improvements projects including, but not limited to: concrete, sheds, swimming pools, electrical updates, installation of water heaters and furnaces and fences.

Commercial Signs

Temporary signage requires a permit, is time-limited and are not allowed to be placed in the right-of-way. Permanent signs, either new or replacement, require a permit and are allowed based on the requirements defined in Village ordinance 9-13-14 "Commercial Districts".

Garage sales

Garage sales are permitted. No license is required, but signage is not allowed in the public parkway (space between sidewalk & street) or on light poles.

Lawn maintenance

It shall be unlawful for an owner/occupant of real property to permit any weed, grass or plant, other than trees, bushes, flowers, or other ornamental plants, to grow to a height exceeding eight inches (8") anywhere in the village.

Pet allowance

No person shall keep a combined total of more than four (4) adult dogs, cats or other domestic animals or pets over six (6) months of age.

Solicitors/Peddlers

Solicitors and peddlers are required to obtain a permit. Issuance of a permit does not convey an endorsement of a product or service by the Village and residents may, at their discretion, ask the solicitor/peddler to leave their premises.
